<p>SCIENCE</p> <p>'Animals including humans'</p> <p>Our challenge will be to write a children's non-fiction book including information texts, posters and leaflets about the human lifecycle. Our aim will be to research and collate information on growth, development, puberty and old age, and present it in a sensitive and logical way that is suited to children aged 8-12!</p>	<p>HISTORY/GEOGRAPHY</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To know the names and location of all the World's continents. To be able to use atlases to research key facts about the World. Each group to research a different thing: Group 1 - longest rivers in each continent; 2 - Mountain ranges in each continent; 3 - Climate in each continent; 4 - Capital Cities of each continent; 5 - Populations and sizes of different countries. <p>Start to prepare a group presentation for the other groups.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To understand how latitude and longitude work and their benefits. To be able to use latitude and longitude to locate places in the World. To know and understand what a human and physical feature is. Match photos of the main human and physical features from the ground to a base map of village. Map of village, and show an aerial photo. Locate certain points in village as a class. Chn to work in pairs to give directions from the school to specific places in the village, whilst recording their directions and writing down key features as they 'go past' them.
