Welcome back everyone! We hope that you all had a happy and healthy Easter break and are ready and eager to go this Summer Term.

Our learning environment at school has undergone significant positive changes over the last few years. This year, we have refreshed our classroom furniture to ensure it is accessible and inviting for the children, and promotes independent learning. We have also been focusing on ensuring our outside provision is more sustainable by introducing

chalkboard signage to replace laminated resources. We have also extended our water play area with guttering stands, which the child have really enjoyed investigating and exploring. Going forward, we are hoping to breathe some life into our sensory garden in our outdoor area, by involving the children in planting projects, to provide a calming space for the children to explore and enjoy.

To start the new term, we have based our provision on the theme of Minibeasts. Our key text for teacher-directed learning is currently Anansi the Spider by Gerald McDermott.

After half term, we will be reading The Tiny Seed by Eric Carle, which will fit in nicely with the growing provocations we will have going on in our learning environment. Phonics will continue for both Ash and Saplings. Saplings will now start to explore blending through games and stories, and Ash will be continuing to strengthen, develop and acquire new special friends, as well as building their knowledge of sentence reading and writing.


